Teacher of the Deaf, Tina Kirwin was involved in the BBC filming. She wrote:

'Last week the film crew from the BBC came into school to film the cue club and the year 6 pupils, who are South African and Somalia, doing their weekly spelling test. The results achieved were those expected: 60% correct when the word was signed to them and 100% when it was spoken and Cued Speech was used - no surprises there. But what happened next thrilled me - I cued to the girls the names of the crew, Jamie and Amie, and one of them cued it back to herself, noticed they rhymed and spelt them correctly on the white board.

Learn to cue or practise online

Some of our courses are designed to incorporate home study using our elearning website: www.learntocue.co.uk. Others are stand alone courses requiring no additional work from home. The website can also be used independently but some face-to-face tuition is strongly recommended. If you do use the website please keep in touch with the office so that we can continue to help you.

To book on to any of the above scheduled courses please contact our office as early as possible to request an enrolment form. Enrolment forms should be completed and returned, with a £20 deposit, at least 2 weeks prior to any training. Our current course costs are as follows: 2 day course: £80, 3 day course: £95, 4 day course: £110, 5 day course: £125. Additional Summer School costs apply for on-site accommodation and lunches. Please contact our office for further details. A discount, or occasionally free tuition, may be available for those with financial constraints.

Cued Speech complete spoken language through vision

Cued Speech is a simple sound-based system comprising eight handshapes, used in four positions near the mouth, in conjunction with the lip patterns of normal speech so as to make all the sounds of spoken language fully comprehensible to deaf and hearing-impaired people.
